Margam, Madhusudhan & Nagabhushanam, V.. (2012) carried out a study on Use of Web-based library services in selected University Libraries in India: A study result shows that majority of the respondents of all university libraries indicated that slow internet connectivity was a major barrier to accessing and use web based library services of University libraries.

Pareek, Sarwesh and Gupta, Dinesh K (2013) in their study on Academic Library Websites in Rajasthan: an analysis of Content Survey of web sites of 52 academic, libraries, i.e. government, deemed self-financed universities and research centres libraries of Rajasthan based on 133-item

checklist found that all 52 web sites were often developed as a routine organisational matter instead of a conscious process of library promotion and marketing. In some websites very few show serious understanding by librarians of the worth of web technology and their professional involvement. Some general features like access, speed, navigation, help facilities etc. may be found, but the placement of library functions like OPAC, circulation, reference, and other interactive services are not highly observed.

Kumar, V. & Bansal, J. (2014) in their study on Qualities of a library website: Evaluating library websites of new IITs found that none of the IITs website qualifies the criteria of a quality website. All the website have different features no one similar with each other.

Objective of the study

- To analyze the use of library website of N. P. Shivaji Mahavidyalaya Mowad.
- To reveal factors and opinions regarding the library website.

Research Methodology

The present study is limited to N. P. Shivaji Mahavidyalaya Library website only. UG student and faculty member are selected for the study. Survey method is use for the study. By simple random sampling and respondents were selected by systematic sampling this for a questionnaire was design and same to be distributed to the UG students and faculty members. 60 students from each class (from B. A. I, II and final year) and 8 teaching faculty are selected for the study out of this 180 students, only 150 questionnaire from UG students and 8 questionnaire from faculty member total 158 (n=158) questionnaire were received.

Data Analysis and Interpretation Experience of Respondents with Internet




Fig. 1 Experience of Respondents with Internet Whole the collected data is systematically presented and analysed with help of figure (graph) among them graph 1 shows that 50% of the faculty members have internet experience of 5-10 yrs., followed by 38 % having more than 10 yrs and 12% with 3-4 yrs experience. From UG student 80% of B. A. I yrs student have less than 1 year experience, followed by 19% with 1-3 yrs and 1% have 3-4 yrs experience of internet. 79% of B. A. II yrs student having less tham

Frequency of Library Website usage




Fig. 2 Frequency of Library website usage

Library staff provides training to the use of Library Website




Fig. 3 Library staff provides training to the use of Library Website

Learn ability on the usage of library Website and its impact




Fig. 4 Learn ability on the usage of library Website and its impact

Overall rating to library website




Fig. 4 Learn ability on the usage of library Website and its impact
